Nov. 25, 1791 - Gov. John Parr died at age 65.

Feb. 1811 - Capt. John Parr of the "Robert", his wife (d.o. Mr. Cunard of Halifax) and their infant child died in Barbados.

June 2, 1835 - Died May 20th Samuel Parr, age 24 at Miramichi. Son of late Capt. Parr.

Dec. 21, 1844 - At Kempt, Frederick Tomlinson marr. Miss Mary Parr

Dec. 25, 1854 - John Parr, age 28 died.

March 6, 1848 - Grace Parr, 47, wife of William, died.

Aug. 20, 1848 - John E. Cabot marr. Sarah Grace, only d.o. William Parr, Barnstable, Devonshire, England (both of Halifax)

Jan. 6, 1851 - John Parr marr. Margaret Ann Gauld

1784 John Parr granted 200 acres Clements Township.

1791 William L. Parr granted 640 acres Halifax- Annapolis Road, part poss. in Lunenburg Co. Escheated (gave the land back to the Crown) in 1819.

1785 John Parr River Rensheg, Cumb. Co., N.S. 200 acres His regiment was shown as Westchester, N.Y.

A grant of 2,800 acres was made to Thomas Parr Esq., John Parr Jr., William Parr and Harriet Parr in Parrsborough on Aug. 8, 1795. Thomas rec'd lot 57, John Jr. 58, William 59 and Harriet Lot 60. Each lot was 700 acres. Same date, Gov. Parr granted 21,380 acres to a number of people, mainly Loyalists.
