

The Estate of Joseph Parr

shall give to his brother James Parr half of the timber for sale. The building to  
on his lot to be decided by the Executors and to my wife Jane Parr. I bequeath  
the sum of fifty dollars each and every year during her life. to be paid by my  
sons John and James Parr say twenty five dollars each. and my sons John  
and James Parr to pay to my son Joseph Parr one hundred pounds half  
fifty pounds each by yearly instalments as they can afford. but not  
less than twenty five dollars a year each. I also bequeath to my wife Jane  
Parr her bed, clothing, bed clothing, bed clothing, Purse and Stone  
and also that my two boys John and James Parr to give sufficient land  
for house and garden on the East half end on the centre between the two lots  
for her life. I also instruct my executors to sell by public Auction the whole  
of my goods, Chattels stock implements &c and the proceeds to be divided  
between my five daughters and also my son John and James Parr to  
give to my son Thomas Parr twenty dollars ten dollars each and that at  
my decease each of my children pay their equal share for my burial &c  
with that James Dickson and his wife shall remain on the spot they now  
live as long as they either shall live. And I also instruct my executors  
to stop the payment to my wife from my sons should she marry.  
Should any debts be owing at my decease they are to be paid by each of  
my children by equal instalments and the charges of proving and registering  
this my will.

And I appoint Samuel Crawford of the Town line between Hancock and  
Biddisph and Samuel Langford of Biddisph on the gravel road near  
Fishes School House as my executors of this my will, And hereby revoking all  
other wills I declare this only to be my last will and testament.
